

REBUILD – ONE YEAR ON

August 2021 – August 2022



It is one year since the new Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan was established.

Rebuild has been here throughout that time. We are amazed and grateful for all that has been accomplished in just a few months...

On 15 August 2021 the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan walked into Kabul and all our staff left. That morning we had signed a contract on a new property for our Early Learning Centre, for our Training Centre, for our Offices and for our home. By the end of that day, we had two properties, no business, no children and no staff!

The next morning, we were so grateful when 3 of our longest-standing members of staff came back. "We thought you needed help moving," they said. So Rebuild moved the first week of the new government.



In the last year we have been re-building Rebuild – in a new building with a new staff and new prototypes! We have grown from 3 to 30 full-time Rebuild staff members, which is more than we had before!



Our **Islamic Child-Focused Learning Teacher Training Modules 1 & 2**, cover Social and Emotional Development and Active Participatory Learning and **have run training for more than 200 teachers in different training in the past 10 months**. Also, 13 Head Teachers and Admin staff of ICFL schools have attended our teacher training workshops.



Supporting young people by creating resources to supplement the national curriculum, and to support teachers was a 4-month project during last winter. **36 Teaching Manuals** were produced along with another **9 students workbooks for dari and pashto literature**. These are now being used by teachers in the schools. They are greatly improving the quality of the children's education.

Our new 6 persons 'Hamiyar' support team work with the teachers in their schools every week, helping them to implement what they have learned on the Islamic Child-Focused Learning training. This helps the teachers to make real-life changes in their teaching methodologies.



All our staff are learning new skills in jobs they have never done before. This is quite a challenge! 28 attended a Staff Management Training over 3 months.

2 Deputy Ministers, 60 Directors and Managers of the new government's Ministry of Information & Culture attended two morning seminars on Leadership & Management. This was at the Ministry's invitation.



Rebuild's new prototype, **Life Skills Laboratories**, is designed for both teenage girls and boys in separate sessions. It takes 36 hours over a three-week period. The programme focuses on building healthy family and community relationships through good **communication skills, social and emotional intelligence and learning how to resolve everyday conflicts**. A total of 101 teenagers (34 boys and 67 girls) have attended 7 pilot workshops in the past 10 months.



Life Skills Labs also include learning through projects. These are designed to supplement subjects on the national curriculum. These teenagers designed and made their own solar ovens for example - They also designed and made their own battery powered motor boats.



Life Skills Labs (LSL) can be held in mosques, schools or anywhere where there is space for 20 young people to create their projects. We are training more facilitators and hope to be able to run LSL in many venues in the future.

Project-Based Learning Skills Laboratories for 18 – 30 year olds are currently being piloted with such projects as Online Business Development.
